I deserve...to be happy.
I deserve...to be able to text my friends...even in class...or while driving.
I deserve...my parent, my school, job or the government to bail me out financially.
I deserve...to be able to try and do it all, even though my day runs out of hours.
I deserve...more vacation and less responsibility.
I deserve...to borrow your stuff and never return it.
I deserve...to be unhappy and fussy because feelings should be expressed.
I deserve...to party and hook up and get my needs met.
I deserve...to buy myself something new because...well, I deserve it.
I deserve...to see any video clip or movie regardless of rating or content.
I deserve...to point out what you did wrong and conceal my part in it.
I deserve... to get into Heaven whether I believe in Jesus or not.
