- Heroes are great, but Jesus calls us to something better.
- Matthew 28:18-20
- He's commissioning us not to be heroes, but to be hero makers.

Jesus the Hero Maker.

- John 14:12
- Matthew 4:18-20
- Why were they fishing? Because they weren't chosen.
- Jesus was regarded by most people as a rabbi, and He was unlike any rabbi ever before!
- Jesus is offering them the chance to change the world and He offers the same opportunity to you and to me.
- The Holy Spirit empowered them to do the things that Jesus had been doing.
- When Jesus said we would do "greater things," it's because He saw like a hero maker.



Jesus Inspires Us to Ask: "Who?"

• Jesus did not need help, but He invited people to participate in His mission!!

Jesus Takes the Initiative.

Jesus Calls Regular People.

- Right from the beginning of his ministry, Jesus thought like a Hero Maker.
- Mark 3:13-15

"He seems to do nothing of himself, which he can possibly delegate to His creatures. He commands us to do slowly and blunderingly what he could do perfectly and in the twinkling of an eye. Creation seems to be delegation through and through. I suppose this is because He is a giver." – C.S. Lewis, Leadership

- You and I get to grab the baton and become hero makers who move the mission forward.
- We need to make a mental shift and think like a hero maker.
