- Luke 6:12-13
- Jesus prayerfully, and deliberately chose twelve in which to invest.

Jesus Identified His People

- It's possible to find ourselves with many relationships, but no significant ones.
- John 3:22
- Diatribo "to brush against."
- When it says Jesus "spent time" with his disciples, it's not just a statement about hours and minutes, it was diatribo: some of Him being passed on to them.

Two Objections

- "I'm no spiritual giant."
- "I just don't have time to be a Hero Maker."

Diatribo doesn't need to be something we add to our schedules. It can be about doing the things we're already doing in a different way.



Diatribo can be about intentionally overlapping your life with someone else in the things you are already doing.

ICNU

- Hero makers see in others what they don't see in themselves.
- Speak to someone's potential instead of just their performance.
- I-C-N-U right now.
- I-C-N your future.

5 Steps

- I Lead, You Watch, We Talk.
- I Lead, You Help, We Talk.
- You Lead, I Help, We Talk.
- You Lead, I Watch, We Talk.
- You Lead, Someone Else Watches, You Talk.
